GI Debates Hybrid Conference

EBMed's GI Debates is a hybrid meeting combining CME networking/mentoring activities for our GI trainees and collaborations with industry during disease break-out sessions. One of EBMed's goals is to facilitate the careers of women, first-generation college graduates, and under-represented minorities in academic gastroenterology and a large proportion of our senior and early-career faculty fit this goal.

The CME portion of the meeting will focus on: (a) inflammatory bowel disease; (b) esophageal disorders, including acid-peptic disorders and eosinophilic esophagitis; (c) GI motility disorders, including irritable bowel syndrome, (d) future of GI, including endoscopic innovation, AI, and obesity management, and (e) metabolic-associated steatohepatitis and complications of cirrhosis.

Specific educational formats include:

- **Debate:** Two senior faculty will debate a provocative clinical question with a third senior faculty serving as judge, and a jury of 6 early-career GI faculty will vote on most persuasive presentation. *[Note: Early-Career GI faculty consist of advanced GI fellows in IBD, GI motility, esophageal disorders or promising academic gastroenterologists who completed training within the past 5 years.]*
- **Case Presentation:** Brief case/patient presentation (HIPAA-compliant) focused on specific treatment options.
- **"Top 5 Tips:"** Nationally-recognized leader discussing how she integrates clinical trial data and clinical experience when managing patients.
- **Guideline Updates:** Nationally-recognized leader reviews key concepts from GI society guidelines, identifies controversies, and discusses how they integrate recommendations into their management.

Networking/Mentoring Activities

EBMed's GI Debates conference is designed to facilitate interaction between senior faculty and GI fellows and GI-APPs, including:

- **GI Trainees Meet-and-Greet** on Friday morning. We recommend that trainees arrive at the meeting by Thursday night, so they can be rested when this busy conference starts on Friday afternoon. Therefore, Friday morning is flexible time for trainees to relax.

Nevertheless, one of the key goals of the meeting is to network with other GI fellows. Your senior faculty performed similar networking exercises when they were trainees and these relationships facilitated work in academic organizations, research projects, and business opportunities throughout their careers. Therefore, a separate "GI Trainee Meet-and-Greet" will be held on the beach on Friday morning with icebreakers, refreshments, and prizes to facilitate your initial networking.

- **GI Trainees Workshop** on Friday afternoon, including "Guide to the Guidelines Update" from Brennan Spiegel, MD followed by "Success Skills Beyond GI Fellowship" planned by Neena Abraham, MD, Director of the ACG Institute Center for Leadership, Ethics, and Equity.
- **Finding the Right Fit: Opportunities in Different GI Settings** on Friday evening, is a dinner program exploring the benefits and limitations of working in academic GI, private equity GI supergroups, locum tenens, and more.
- **"Office Hours"** on Saturday afternoon, offers 1:1 meetings with senior faculty to discuss research opportunities and career development at EBMed's dedicated site on the Fort

Lauderdale beach, adjacent to the Westin Fort Lauderdale Beach Resort. Refreshments will be served and pre-meeting sign-ups will be offered.

- **GI Jeopardy Competition** will be held in conjunction with Saturday night dinner for trainees and GI-APPs. A brief product theater will be presented with dinner. After dinner, GI Trainees and GI-APPs will be divided into teams for a brief, but very competitive round of GI Jeopardy questions based on material presented during the conference. Educational prizes awarded to members of 1st, 2nd, and 3rd place winning teams
- **EBMed's Karaoke Saturday Night** is a new tradition for this meeting. Partner with your favorite faculty to sing the night away in this new EBMed tradition.

Unique Features of Our Program:

We've designed this meeting in response to comments from multiple stakeholders who have attended similar meetings. Specifically,

- **The location, Fort Lauderdale,** can be reached by direct flights from most major cities in the East, South, and Midwestern US, and the hotel location is a 15-20 minute drive from the airport, making it easy for you to fly to the meeting.
- **GI-APP Integration:** Current GI practice reflects collaboration between GI-APPs and Gastroenterologists. Therefore, we've expanded to offer 30 travel grants to GI-APPs. While GI-APPs trainees and faculty will participate with GI trainees in the continuing education sessions on Saturday morning and Sunday morning, GI-APPs also have unique educational and career development needs. Therefore, our GI-APP Integration includes the following GI-APP exclusive events: **(a) GI-APP Horizons on Friday morning.** This hybrid event combines didactic lectures

and small group case studies on two different GI clinical topics with career development talks about “Re-negotiating Contracts”, “Making the Ask” about Changes in your clinical role; Building Your Network of Senior GI-APP Mentors; and Opportunities in Industry. **(b) GI-APP Trivia Dinner on Friday Night**, which is only available to GI-APPs, will begin with buffet dinner and product theater presentation by an industry partner. For dessert, After dinner, GI-APPs will be divided into teams for a brief, but very competitive round of GI Jeopardy questions based on material presented during the conference.

Educational prizes awarded to members of 1st, 2nd, and 3rd place winning teams. (c) **“GI-APP Office Hours” on Saturday afternoon** will be a separate event for GI-APPs, although this will also be conducted on the beach with refreshments offered. GI-APP faculty and Industry personnel will be present to discuss career development topics, including finding mentors in professional GI organizations. Pre-meeting sign-ups will be offered to facilitate organization.

- **Reception** will be held prior to dinner on Friday evening. This is another important aspect of networking

between early-career and senior GI faculty and industry attendees.

- **Approved for 7.75 hours** of continuing education for physicians, PA-Cs and NPs.

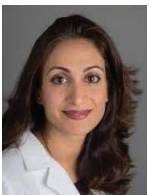

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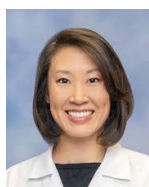
